## INDEXING

Our goal is to index research funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) at PubMed <https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed/> , and to index research funded by the National Science Foundation (NSF) and the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) at the NSF Public Access Repository (NSF-PAR) <https://par.nsf.gov> Please note that we cannot guarantee that JEAMS will ever get indexed for PubMed, NSF-PAR, etc..

First, the process of getting indexed takes years. To apply for inclusion in PubMed, for example, new publishers are required to publish and to submit a minimum of 30 peer reviewed original research and review articles, clinical case reports, data descriptor articles, or descriptions of clinical or surgical procedures. A journal that does not meet the scientific quality or technical quality standards at any stage of the application process only becomes eligible to reapply to PubMed in 24 months, when a minimum of 20 new different articles have been published.

Second, there is considerable infrastructure cost to applying to PubMed, for example. Our print journal would need to digitize every back issue (although offering an online or e-journal version is not a requirement). Every article would need to be converted to XML (eXtensible Markup Language) format and every authors' data would need to meet various technical quality standards. However, our nonprofit organization tries not to charge a penny to authors, which eliminates a major revenue stream that could fund that infrastructure cost. Instead, JEAMS will need to be successful with charitable donations, subscription fees, advertising revenue, etc..
